

I haven't submitted an article for the newsletter for a long time; and it seems important to try to do so now. I have been troubled by depression and anxiety for some time now. But today I have new hope! I prayed last night for help from God in dealing with my symptoms (which involved having a terribly hard time getting up, and staying up, in the mornings). This morning, when I was trying to get up and get going, it seemed like I was going to have my usual hard time. So I prayed to Jesus to help me, and He responded right away by giving me the will and the energy to stay out of bed and move on with the day (with no depression or anxiety!) I think prayer will be key in helping this to happen every morning—just recognizing my weakness and calling out to God for help.

Relatives and friends have been telling me for a long time that they are praying for me; but what was missing was my praying for myself and asking God directly for help! I need to continue to believe that God is hearing my prayers and will respond each time I ask. Maybe it won't always be as "easy" or immediate as today was; but I know now that I have to keep on having a relationship with God and not sit back

and let others do all the praying. And I need recognize others' needs for my praying for them too. It's too hard to remember all the names, but I can pray in general, especially for those with mental health challenges like mine. May the New Year be good to all of us! Carol Y.

"One day I was at Patriot Square and I saw David squatting in front of the movie theatre having a cigarette. I asked where


the group was and he said they were inside watching the movie. So I gave him
